**NWC PIPE REPAIRS NOW COMPLETED ON WASHINGTON BOULEVARD
WATER SUPPLY DISTRIBUTION NOW STARTED FOR AFFECTED AREAS**

The National Water Commission is advising that its teams have now completed the emergency pipeline repairs that forced the shutdown of water supply along the **Washington Boulevard in St Andrew**. The Company is further noting that the system was restarted earlier and all seemed on track for the original timeline of 6pm – but a shift in the pipeline required a subsequent shutdown in order to make the corrective adjustments. The team is now re-opening the main valves in order to distribute water to the affected areas.

Updated restoration time: **10pm, Tonight, Monday- September 19, 2022**

Affected Areas include: **Duhaney Park, New Haven, Patrick City, Washington Gardens, Sections of Molyne's Road, Penwood, Waterhouse, Seaward Drive and sections of Olympic Gardens**

Customers are being reminded that they may experience low pressures throughout tonight as the network recharges.

The Company is also extending its deepest apologies to motorists for any traffic delays that may have been caused by this unforeseen incident.

The National Water Commission thanks its valued customers for their extended patience and understanding – especially to residents and business operators in the Duhaney Park and Waterhouse areas and seeks to assure them that every effort is being made to restore water supply within the shortest possible time.
