OPERATIONAL CHALLENGES CAUSE WATER DISRUPTION SECTIONS OF ST. CATHERINE AND CLARENDON AFFECTED

The National Water Commission is advising customers in some sections of St. Catherine, who are served by the Sligoville Booster Stations 1 to 4, that their water supply disruption is due to mechanical problems affecting operations at the facilities.

Restoration of water supply is estimated by later today, November 8, 2018.

Areas impacted are: **Breadfruit Gully, Pleasant Hill, Keith Hall, Binns Close, Bottom Jackson, Bottom Kensington, Sligoville Community, James Mountain, Cedar Valley, Stanberry Grove, Top Kensington, Top Mary's Village, James Lane, Burke Lane and Sligoville Main Road**

Also in St. Catherine, customers served by the Keystone Pumping Station are without service as a result of JPSCo power supply problems.

Affected areas are: **Keystone, Mount View Estate, Tryall Heights, St Jago Heights and Tryall Estate**

The company is also reporting that the New Town Pumping Station in Clarendon was forced to shut down due to a broken main on the distribution pipeline.

Restoration of water supply will resume by later this evening, November 8, 2018

Areas impacted are: **New Town Phases 1 and 2**

Meanwhile in Clarendon, customer served by both the Campbell Hill and Patterson Springs Facilities are without water supply due to high turbidity levels affecting operations the facilities.

Affected areas are: **Trout Hall, Trout Hall Housing Scheme and Sanguinetti**

Customers are being assured that the NWC team is making every effort to restore regular water supply to the affected areas in the shortest possible time.
