**HIGH TURBIDITY AND SINGLE PHASE PROBLEMS DISRUPTS WATER SUPPLY
SECTIONS OF CLARENDON, ST. ANDREW AND ST. ANN AFFECTED**

The **National Water Commission** is reporting that high turbidity levels have forced the suspension of operations at the **Fairburn Spring, Campbell Hill Entombment, Crooked River, New Ground and Drummond Spring Pump Stations in Clarendon.**

This has resulted in some areas in the Parish currently without regular water supply and these include **Fairburn, James Hill, Bog Hole, Corner Shop, Salem, Desire, Trout Hall, Trout Hall Housing Scheme, Crooked River, Pennants, Mears, Bryans Hill, John Austin, Baptist, Ballard's River, Orange Hill, Drummond Spring, Beckford Kraal, Iron Gate, Trumpet Tree, New Ground, Peterkin, Suttons, Summerfield, Rose Hill, Chapelton and Sangster's Heights Housing Scheme.**

Customers can expect restoration of water supply as soon as conditions have improved for the resumption of operations at the facilities.

Meanwhile, the **Rock Hall and Roaring River Pumping Stations in St. Andrew and St. Ann** respectively, are currently out of service due to single phase power supply problems.

Areas affected are:

St. Andrew: - **Coopers Hill, Rock Hall, Part of Red Hills, Topper Hill, Mount Atlas, Belvedere Drive, Waugh Hill, Carr Hill, Frazer Crescent, Woodland, Woodland Circle and Walker's Hill.**

St. Ann: - **Steer Town, Chalky Hill, Davis Town, Roaring River Housing Scheme and surrounding areas and Malvern Park.**

The public power provider is working to have the problems corrected and upon completion, operations will be restarted at the affected facilities.
