**HIGH TURBIDITY DISRUPT WATER

The National Water Commission (NWC) wishes to apologise to customers in sections of **St. James, Trelawny** and **Westmoreland**, for the disruption in their water supply due to high turbidity which is affecting operations at a number of its facilities.

The NWC is assuring customers that normal operations will resume as soon as the turbidity subsides.
