UPDATE WATER DISRUPTION

...sections of St. James, Hanover, Trelawny and St. Ann affected

The National Water Commission (NWC) is advising that, operations at the **Great River** Treatment plant in **St. James** and the **Martha Brae** Treatment Plant in **Trelawny**, are still being affected due to blocked intakes.

The Great River plant is currently operating at 75% capacity, while the Martha Brae plant is operating at 65% capacity. As a result, customers served by these facilities will continue to experience either low water pressure, intermittent supply or no water.

Areas likely to be affected include:

Zion, Saigon, Coral Gardens, Ironshore, Lilliput, Guava Walk, Spring Gardens, Belmont, Tower Hill, Moy Hall, Unity Hall. Greenwood, Cornwall, Barrett Town and Providence.
