HIGH TURBIDITY AFFECTS WATER SUPPLY TO SECTIONS OF ST. JAMES AND WESTMORELAND

The National Water Commission (NWC) wishes to apologise to customers served by the **Dantrout** pumping station and the **Cambridge** treatment plant in **St. James**, for the disruption in their water supply, due to high levels of turbidity at the facilities.

The NWC is assuring customers that normal operations will resume as soon as the turbidity subsides.

Affected areas include:

In St. James

Dantrout, Marchmount Road, German Town, Seaford Town, St. Leonards, Mt. Spring, Coffee Ground, Chesterfield and Gardener served by the **Dantrout** facility. **Bickersteth, Seven Rivers, Richmond Hill, Shortwood, Cambridge** and **Ducketts** served by the **Cambridge** facility.

In Westmoreland

Grange, Bethel Town, Argyle Mountain and Lambs River.
